Welcome to the MedFlex™ Network

Medical Mutual has partnered with major health systems across Ohio to create the MedFlex network. This network provides members access to high-quality, affordable healthcare in more than 70 counties, covering 80 percent of the state. With provider locations in major cities, small towns and rural areas, MedFlex is designed to provide members access to healthcare where they live, work and play.

The MedFlex network not only includes convenient locations, it is also made up of providers who have implemented patient-focused care models. Through clinical integration, providers coordinate patient care more effectively and efficiently through all stages of life, ensuring appropriate healthcare is administered over time. In addition, many providers participate in value-based agreements, meaning they are incentivized based on patient health outcomes, efficiency and quality of care. These models help improve the overall patient care experience and reduce costs for both employers and employees.



Network Availability

The MedFlex network is currently available to the following employer groups:

- Large groups (100 or more employees) can offer the network on a self-funded or fully insured basis for maximum flexibility
- Midsize groups (51–99 employees) can offer the network on a fully insured basis only
- Small groups (50 or fewer employees) can offer the network through:
 - Affordable Care Act (ACA)-compliant plans (no medical questionnaires required)
 - Multiple employer welfare arrangement (MEWA) plans by joining the Council of Smaller Enterprises (COSE) or a participating chamber

MedFlex is a great option for employers and employees who live or work in the MedFlex service areas. This network can be offered as an HMO on a replacement or dual basis along with PPO plans like SuperMed®. Employers should encourage employees to select this network by providing contribution strategies and benefit designs that result in maximum savings.

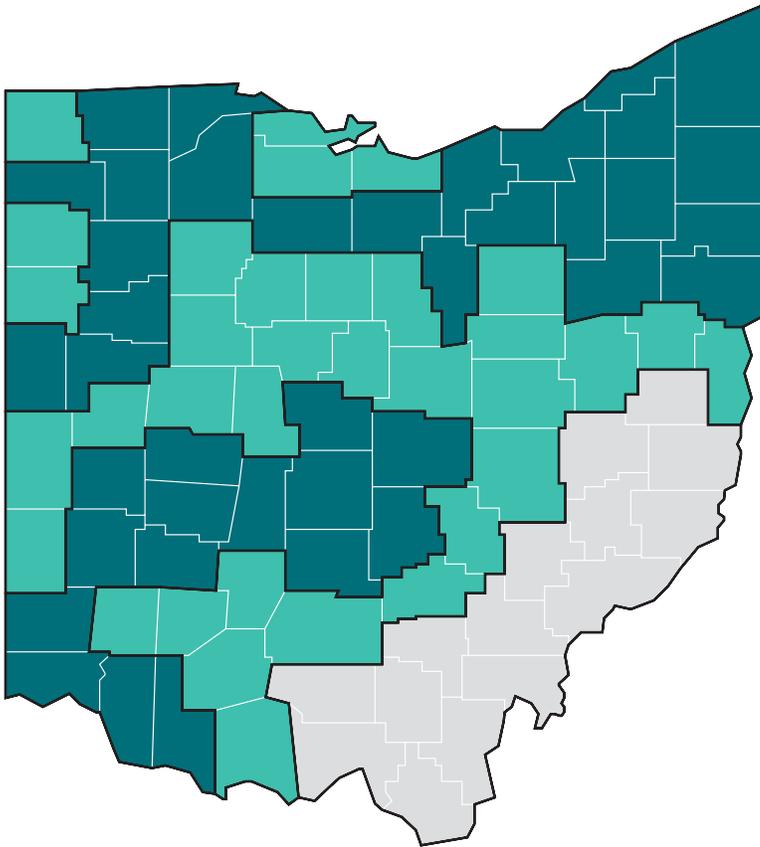
The MedFlex network makes it easy to meet the needs of your employees with more than 3,000 primary care physicians, 10,000 specialists and 70 hospitals across the state.

Benefits Overview

MedFlex gives employers and employees access to complete benefits, excellent care and cost control measures to help manage premiums and out-of-pocket costs. As a non-gatekeeper HMO, it doesn't require members to coordinate care through a primary care physician, so they can access specialists directly and save money. However, it is requested that members select a primary care physician as regular health screenings can lead to better health outcomes and reduced costs.

Employers with 50 or fewer employees can access eight ACA-compliant benefit plans. Employers with 51–99 employees may choose from a suite of standard plans. Customized plans are available for employers with 100 or more employees.

Pharmacy Benefits

A wide variety of generic, brand and specialty medications are available through the National Preferred Plus formulary. These medications can be ordered through the Walgreens Advantage Network, which includes most major national and regional pharmacies, such as Walgreens and Discount Drug Mart.

Additionally, safety controls are available through a fraud, waste and abuse program while cost and utilization controls are included through programs such as Coverage Management, Specialty Drug Solutions, Generic Incentive, Mandatory Mail and Compound Drug Management.

Emergency Services

Emergencies requiring immediate medical attention are always covered at any hospital regardless of network status. However, there is no emergency room coverage for non-emergency care.

Nurse Line

MedFlex includes access to Nurse Line, where a registered nurse is available to answer health-related questions 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The Nurse Line is available by phone or through the member website, My Health Plan. Members and dependents can use Nurse Line to determine what type of care is needed.
